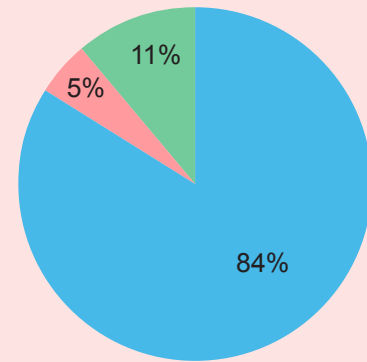

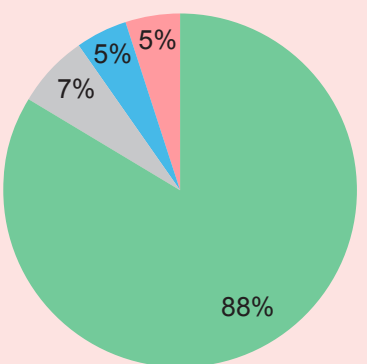

Their gift made it possible to purchase Inpatient Center patient room furnishings suitable for pediatric patients including: a medically appropriate crib, toys, artwork and a video monitor so that parents can watch over their child when they are not in the same room.

The Hospice Center was constructed solely through the generosity of our donors and is the only hospice inpatient facility in our 16 county service area. Regardless of age or where they reside, those who seek hospice support receive the benefits of improved quality of life.

The Hospice Center is an important resource in our community that requires ongoing care and maintenance. Our Hospice Offers Free Community-Wide Bereavement Support

“The death of someone you love can shake the foundation of your existence and affect both mind and body...you can become preoccupied with thoughts, memories, and images of your friend or loved one, have difficulty accepting the finality of the loss, and experience waves of sadness and yearning.” (Harvard Health Publishing 2018)

It is during these critical first 13 months after the death of a loved one that Our Hospice’s team of bereavement specialists provides the support that grieving family members need in order to successfully transition through the finality of loss. One of our programs, Camp Eva, provides grief support to children between the ages of 5 and 12 through play, discussion, journaling and interactive activities. Camp Eva is designed to:



- Educate children and parents about the grieving process
- Provide comfort and help children process their feelings as they mourn their loss
- Help children develop coping skills that can be used in their everyday lives
- Increase support systems and reduce feelings of aloneness and isolation

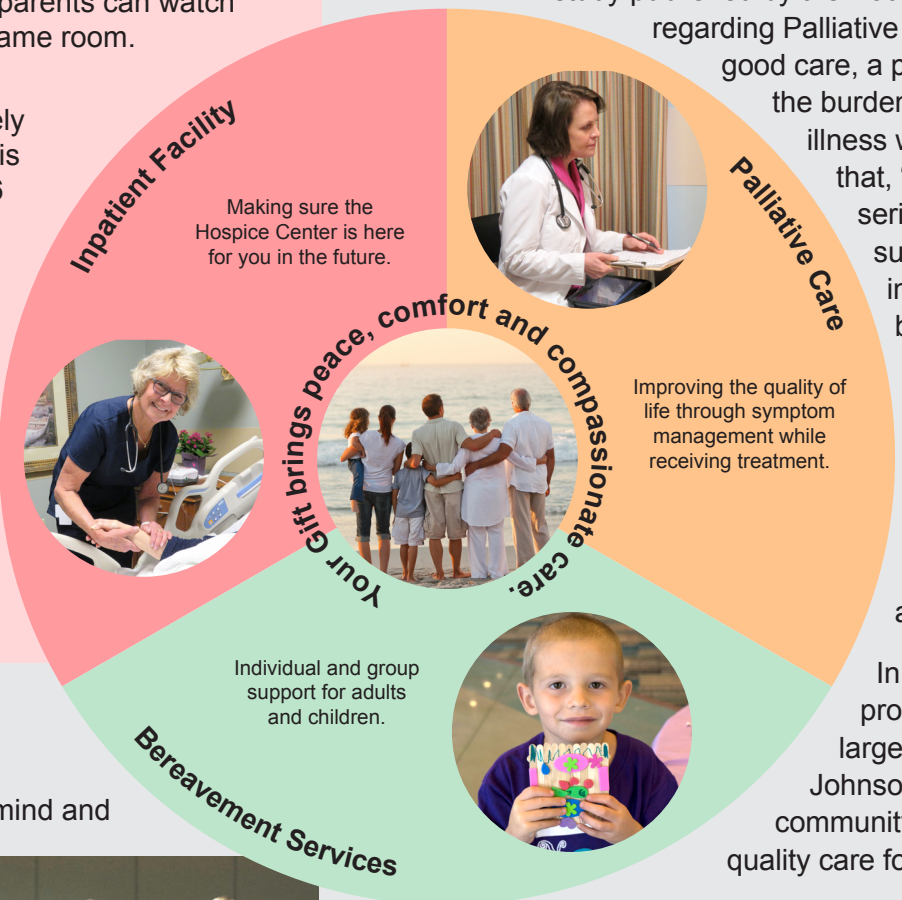
Camp Eva and all Our Hospice’s bereavement programs are funded solely by charitable gifts. We are very grateful for the contributions that support these very important programs.

Palliative Care

Symptom Management Specialists

“Palliative Care reduces hospital admissions and emergency room visits for patients with complex medical needs” ...a simple statement with a big impact on the quality of life of an individual with a chronic or life-limiting illness. Mary has suffered with COPD for years; shortness of breath, discomfort, anxiety and depression now dominate her life. Mary’s lung specialist suggested coordination of care with a palliative care symptom management specialist to expand Mary’s circle of care and improve her quality of life.



A study published by the National Academy for State Health Policy regarding Palliative Care concluded that, “Palliative care is good care, a person-centered approach that can ease the burden of disease for individuals with serious illness while reducing avoidable spending” and that, “as more people live longer with complex serious conditions, approaches to care that support the quality of life – while honoring individual needs and preferences will become increasingly important.”

Unlike hospice care, palliative care can be delivered alongside of curative treatment and much like hospice care, a patient’s plan of care is managed by a team of care professionals. This care team builds a rapport and relationship with the patient, the patient’s family members, and their physicians to create a personalized plan of care that includes symptom and medication management; discussion regarding treatment goals; education about their illness; and support across all care needs.

In 2019 Our Hospice is starting a Community Based Palliative Care program providing support to patients in their home setting. Because Palliative Care remains largely unreimbursed, it is only through the generosity of Ruth, Jenny, Rick and Alice Johnson; John and Judy Kussman, the estate of Ronnie Van Sweringen and other community supporters that we are able to provide this innovative, proven program of high-quality care for individuals with complex illnesses.

We are grateful to our donors for their support of the care we provide to the members of our communities. Excellent and compassionate, Palliative, Hospice and Bereavement Care; to make every moment count for our patients and their families.

Palliative care, also known as palliative medicine, is specialized medical care for people living with serious illnesses. It is focused on providing patients with relief from the symptoms and stress of a serious illness or the effects of the treatment—whatever the diagnosis. The goal is to improve quality of life for both the patient and the family.

Palliative care is provided by a team of doctors, nurses, and other specialists who work with a patient's other doctors to provide an extra layer of support. Palliative care is appropriate at any age and at any stage in a serious illness, and can be provided together with curative treatment.
